

### Information for Parents for KS1 Children

Homework is an opportunity to communicate between home and school so that all children can succeed in their learning. Regular homework is important as it gives children the opportunity to reinforce learning from the classroom and to further develop their skills.

#### How you can support your child with homework:

Parents or carers should try to provide a reasonably peaceful, suitable place in which their child can do homework either by themselves or with an adult. They should make it clear to their children that they value homework, and support the school in explaining how it can help their learning. They should try to become actively involved in joint homework activities with children. At any time a parent can talk to staff about homework.

Homework will be sent home every Friday and is expected to be returned to school by the following Wednesday. In addition to this weekly homework, each term children will be set a creative piece of homework related to a 'Big Question'. For example: Why is the sky blue? This homework will be displayed and celebrated in school.
